The Great Commandment

³⁴But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. ³⁵And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" ³⁷And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. ³⁸This is the great and first commandment. ³⁹And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. ⁴⁰On these two commandments depend on all the Law and the Prophets."

We are taking time to focus on spiritual disciplines to assist us to continually grow our affection for God and become more like him. In 1 Timothy, Paul encourages Timothy to train himself for godliness. Another way to think of this is "Godlikeness." We are preparing ourselves to be more and more like Christ. We want to love God more and who he is. Romans 12:9 says, Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. In other words, we are to love what God loves and hate what God hates. Through God's grace, we can accomplish becoming more like Christ through training. Through focusing on our spiritual disciplines, we can form routines and rhythms to our lives to help refocus and recalibrate our affections to Christ.

There is a memorable scene from an NBA game where Dikembe Mutumbo, as a rookie, played Michael Jordan. No stranger to trash-talking, Michael Jordan got Mutombo's attention and said, "Hey, Mutombo, this one's for you," then closed his eyes and entered his shooting motion. Unsurprisingly, he hit nothing but net. What is remarkable is that Jordan was so good and familiar with shooting free throws through practice and muscle memory that he didn't need his eyes open to hit that shot. Welcome to the NBA.

This type of muscle memory is what we are striving for with spiritual disciplines. We are training for godliness, so we have Godly reflexes, whatever circumstance we face. We can love God and others with our eyes closed. Here is a list of the spiritual disciplines to help us love God more deeply.

Worship Fasting

Scripture Fellowship/community

Prayer Hospitality
Simplicity/Gratitude Service
Rest/Slow/Sabbath Vocation
Story/Identity Stewardship

As we enter this time of studying spiritual disciplines, consider which disciplines would be the most beneficial for you. You don't need to try to be good at all of them. Pick 3-4 to focus on growing in. Remember, this isn't a solo endeavor. Encourage one another by asking someone else which disciplines they have chosen. If you are focusing on similar disciplines, help hold one another accountable. Pray for one another.

These disciplines are tools to help us deepen our love of God and expand our love for others. I am praying for each of you that this time of study will be fruitful for us.

Week Four: AGAPE LOVE – Love and charity that is unselfish and concerned with the greatest good of another. God's love for us and our love for God is agape love.


What are ways you can put agape love into actions?


Study Items:
