I am excited because this month, Redeemer is hosting Vacation Bible School. VBS was such a fun part of my childhood. There are three things I am hoping we can accomplish with VBS. 1) Helping kids to hear about Jesus. 2) allowing our church to invite families to participate. 3) Fun for everyone to participate.

Vacation Bible School has been a regular part of church summers for years. VBS is an effective way to help kids learn about Jesus and to have fun while doing it. VBS is such an essential tool in our tool belt for churches to provide kids an opportunity to hear the gospel and deepen their discipleship. Jared Kennedy, a family pastor, and friend writes, "A one-week VBS provides a great opportunity for Christian kids and parents to invite their un-churched friends and neighbors. The un-churched family might see the event simply as a way to get free childcare or a chance for their child to grow socially. But the child who attends a full week of VBS encounters more intentional Bible teaching than they would receive in nearly five months of regular attendance at Sunday School." VBS allows us to accelerate the learning curve kids have about Jesus.

Vacation Bible School allows us to invite children of family members, neighbors, and coworkers that may not have a church home. For many folks today, going to church is challenging. Going to church is problematic for multiple reasons. 1) Going somewhere and something new is uncomfortable. Just think back to the last time you went somewhere unfamiliar. Not knowing where to go or how to act can make someone decide to stay home. If you ask someone to join you, people are more likely to join you to check it out. Dr. Thom Rainer in *The Unchurched Next Door* "Eighty-two percent of the unchurched are at least somewhat likely to attend church if invited." Rainer says, "Only two percent of church members invite an unchurched person to church. Ninety-eighty percent of church-goers never extend an invitation in a given year." We need to become proactive and confident to help Redeemer grow. 2) Bad experiences at a previous church. A Barna Research Group study among unchurched adults shows that "nearly four out of every ten non-churchgoing Americans (37%) said they avoid churches because of their negative past experiences or with church people." We can help to reverse that experience with VBS. Another reason is more and more people are not attending church. According to Pew Research, only 28% of people say they attend church regularly. A Gallup poll shows that 47% of Americans identify as church members. That number is 20 points lower than in 1940 when more than 70% of Americans identified with church membership.

One of our goals is for everyone to have fun. Everyone, not just the kids but the volunteers as well. Major kudos to Kim and Cheryl for all the work and time they have put in for all the decorations they've already made. The decorations are bright, imaginative, and engaging, not just for kids but for all of us. The registration table has some extraordinary decorations. The VBS decorations are like Christmas decorations. They are preparing our expectations for fun we are going to have. Whether we have one child, 20 kids, or more, I hope all of us will find our inner kids

Greetings Redeemer Family!

Let me be the first to express to all of you my excitement about serving God and this church. Your well wishes and kind words are much appreciated. I look forward in the coming days to planning, preparing, and getting to know all of you better. In the spirit of building relationships, here is a brief overview of my life and experiences.



My hometown is Carl Junction, Missouri, which is very close to Joplin. I grew up going to church every Sunday and Wednesday with my family. I was raised that church was not about something you do but it was deeply a part of who you are. I committed my life to Christ at a very young age and was deeply involved in my youth group. My faith became very real when I lost my mom after her 5-year battle with cancer: I was only 13. This experience shaped me in a unique way to think about how I could serve God and others.

In high school, I felt led to pursue ministry as a vocational calling. I attended a small liberal arts college in Northeast Arkansas and completed my BA in Church Music. In Arkansas I was licensed as a minister. I then attended seminary in Texas and spent a summer doing missions work in Morocco and Spain. All along the way I have served as a minister in churches in Arkansas, Texas, and Missouri.

After leaving seminary, I pastored a small church in Doe Run, Missouri and was ordained. I really enjoyed my time getting to know the church members and the community. I felt the pull to do something in ministry outside the doors of the local church. An opportunity opened up for me to pursue chaplaincy.

I became the prison chaplain at Potosi Correctional Center, a level 5 maximum security prison where all male death row inmates in Missouri are incarcerated. I received an education for which no seminary or formal training could prepare me. During my time there, I was involved in seven death penalty cases. I enjoyed building relationships with the men and hearing their life experiences. I wanted them to know that with God all things could be forgiven and that they could have a new lease on life. Unfortunately, the work took a mental, emotional, and spiritual toll and God had a new calling on my life.

For 15 years, I served as a hospital chaplain at Parkland Health Center/BJC in Farmington, Missouri. I enjoyed comforting patients in their darkest moments and helping families when accidents or crises occurred. Often my work focused on listening to people and praying with them. I officiated over 200 funerals, 45 weddings, and was on 24-hour call for 13 years. During this time, I met my wife, Jamie, and this summer we will celebrate 15 years of marriage. She is the love of my life and the most compassionate person I have ever known. I also completed my MA in Bioethics/Health Care Policy from Loyola University in Chicago and led the ethics committee.

In December 2016, Jamie and I moved back to St. Louis to help care for her parents. As the culture has changed, the opportunities for chaplaincy have become scarce. For the last three and a half years, I have been a human resources business partner with BJC. I have been employed at St. Louis Children's hospital the last eighteen months.

I am a lifelong learner and enjoy international, documentary, and independent films. You will see me walking frequently in the neighborhood and even walking to church. My wife and I enjoy traveling nationally and internationally. Coffee is very important to me, and I have been a home coffee roaster for 12 years. Most importantly, I love God, His Church and St. Louis. My life verse is Hebrews 12:14, "Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and be holy. Without holiness no one will see the Lord."



GROWING IN PRAYER



Redeemer Vacation Bible School will be held June 13-17, 2022. VBS is a week of outreach, worship, growth, and fun for kids to learn more about God and worship Him. Dozens of hours are spent preparing lessons, snacks, decorations, volunteers, schedules, and details. But one need remains constant – the need for prayer. Not only does prayer prepare us for the work God will do during VBS, prayer is the work. Evangelist and teacher, Oswald Chambers reminded us, "Prayer does not fit us for the greater work; prayer is the greater work."

We invite you to pray over all aspects of VBS by using the daily prayer suggestions provided here.

- June 1 This year's VBS is titled "Monumental-Celebrating God's Greatness" and aims to teach children how to have rock-solid faith for the road ahead by focusing on God's love, strength, and faithfulness. Pray the songs, lessons, and activities would be effective tools in teaching children how to tap into the power of God.
- June 2 Pray for the plans being made for VBS. Pray the planning committee will hear the Spirit's leading and follow accordingly. Pray for the right volunteers to step forward.
- June 3 Pray that parents would place importance on their children attending VBS and help them get there each day, support the week in prayer, and help where needed.
- June 4 Pray for the teachers who will be teaching the Bible lessons and imparting Biblical truths each day. Pray they will hear from the Spirit what to say, how to say it, and that it will be heard with open hearts.
- June 5 Pray for the children who will attend VBS. Pray especially that those children who are un-churched or do not know Jesus will be able to attend.
- June 6 Pray for those planning, preparing, and leading various areas of VBS, that the other "life needs" in their day would be accomplished quickly or taken care of (e.g., meals, childcare, daily tasks, work issues, etc.) so they have the time needed to prepare decorations, gather supplies and study the lessons.
- June 7 Pray the efforts to spread the word about VBS would be fruitful and that many kids would hear about the week and desire to come.
- June 8 Pray parents and community members would help spread the word about VBS.
- June 9 All those involved in VBS have many plans and details swimming around in their heads. Pray they may remember that God is the God of all things impossible. Pray God gives them strength as they trust Him with the details.
- June 10— Pray all VBS volunteers and children are healthy and safe during the week. Pray against anything that can hinder a safe and fun experience.
- June 11 Pray that all our volunteers would have a heart for the ministry they are engaged in during VBS.
- June 12 Pray all the leaders, volunteers, and kids get a good night's rest and that all obstacles are removed from kid's being able to come tomorrow!
- June 13— Today is the first day of VBS! Pray for an energetic start; for all the details to flow smoothly, for the kids to enjoy what they are learning and desire to return. Most importantly, pray for Jesus to be proclaimed!

- June 14 Today is the second day of VBS. Pray that the kids would bring friends to share in the experience with them. Pray all the planned activities are fun, engaging, and compel children to return and invite others.
- June 15 Praise God for all He is doing through VBS! Pray for energy and strength for all those teaching and volunteering in other capacities.
- June 16 Today, the VBS curriculum presents the gospel message. Pray it will be heard, received, and planted deep in the hearts of the children.
- June 17 Praise God for a wonderful week! Thank Him for His faithfulness. Pray for the kids and their parents who are not connected to the church to seek connection. Pray for salvation and growth as the VBS lessons are remembered!
- June 18 Pray the good connections made with the children by the VBS crew leaders, teachers and other volunteers made each child feel a sense of belonging.
- June 19 Praise God for all the volunteers that helped at VBS for the week.
- June 20 Praise God for giving our church this opportunity of sharing our all and our love for Him through Vacation Bible School.
- June 21 Pray the Word that was sown in the hearts of the children would be protected, grow, and produce everlasting life.
- June 22 Pray the parents of those who attended VBS would be reached as well and connect with Jesus.
- June 23 Pray for the children who are too old to attend VBS but still need to hear the message that Jesus loves them. Pray that the Word will reach them and make an eternal impact in their lives.
- June 24 Pray the songs the children sang will get "stuck" in their hearts and minds, reminding them of the truths they learned long after VBS is over.
- June 25 Pray for the people of our community, especially the children. Pray that God's spirit will move, and people will seek to know Him.
