This month we will begin a new series on the book of Acts. I am excited as we dive into studying this book together. The book of Acts takes us back in time to see the birth of the Church. It helps us see the struggles of the early church, the coming of the Holy Spirit, Paul's conversion, and the early missionary journeys. It is the next chapter in the story after Jesus' resurrection.

As I've been reading and preparing for the series I found three important reasons why we should study Acts.

- 1) it's important to know the church's history and what happened after Jesus's resurrection.
- 2) the importance of unity that Luke writes about how early Christians resolved the conflict.
- 3) the importance of salvation to Luke and not only in the gospel but also in the book of Acts.

The book of Acts is history. Luke gives a history of Christ and the beginning of the church. He gives eyewitness accounts. He gives his own accounts of research he did as he scoured the area. He wrote them down in an orderly manner for Theophilus and for us today.

Luke is giving us an account of the church staying unifying in the midst of conflict. The early church had a conflict between Samaritans and Jews and Jewish and Gentile Christians. We see in Acts 15 that the church came together to find common ground as the church was working its way around the world. Going forward as a unified Church.

Luke is preaching salvation. Preaching to those in Jesus' time and to us today. Luke chapter 3:6 Luke gives Isaiah's prophecy and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'" in Acts 2:17 here Luke quotes another prophet, Joel. "And in the last days, it shall be, God declares,

that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh. Here we see the thread that binds the gospel and the book of Acts. We see the declaration through Jesus from the Old Testament prophets. We see both Peter and Paul declaring salvation to the entire world not just to the Jews!

These are some of the reasons why I am excited to study the book of Acts. I am praying it will be a blessing to you, our church, and our community. I ask you to please be in prayer for our church that we will hear God's voice and renew a passion and drive to proclaim salvation to the ends of the earth.



What Difference Can Five Days Make?





GROWING IN PRAYER



Starting in May with a new sermon series, Pastor Jeff will bring us into the Book of Acts.

The first thing we thought of when contemplating this article is that the book of Acts is about the beginnings of the Church. Jesus has ascended into Heaven and the apostles gather a community around them. In Acts 2:42-46 we see the church focused on God's word, worship, eating together and taking care of one another.

How does our church focus on God's Word?

How does our church worship God?

How does our church, even in these COVID times, eat together?

How does our church take care of one another?

In what ways can we be praying for our church in these areas?

Other major themes of Acts are the Holy Spirit and the Gospel. In Acts, the Holy Spirit is promised by Jesus, and we can see many occurrences of people being filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit also brings empowerment to the church. The Spirit brings "empowerment for mission," equipping every believer with the message of the Gospel, the power of the Gospel, and the ability to proclaim and live out the Gospel. Jesus did not want us to remain unmoved by the Gospel. How can you be directed by the Holy Spirit to experience the Gospel message of salvation? How can being directed by the Holy Spirit help you to know and share the Gospel message with others? Pray for where you might need help with this.

WE FOUND THIS INTERESTING. When you have some time, read the book of Acts and notice: Acts also reminds us of the-importance of prayer. There is a reference to prayer 31 times in this book, and prayer is present before almost any significant event described by Luke. Miracles are preceded by prayer. Decisions are preceded by prayer. 
Study Items:
