Matthew 9:35-38

35 And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; 38 therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."



As fall quickly approaches, our attention turns to harvests and thanksgiving—a time to celebrate God's faithfulness over the past year. Our business meeting discussed four focus areas over the next year. We are focusing on Music, Infrastructure, Discipleship, and Outreach. We will spend prayer, time, energy, and resources in these areas to help grow.

The truth about improving anything, whether a golf swing, a new patio, or areas in our church, is that it takes time to develop. A metaphor that we often can utilize is planting seeds to wait and for the harvest to see results. For those of us who prefer instant gratification, this is an inconvenient reality in the world in which we live.

Find some encouragement about working to build something up. Thomas Merton provides some insight. He says, "Every moment and every event of every man's life on earth plants something in his soul. For just as the wind carries thousands of invisible and visible winged seeds, so the stream of time brings with it germs of spiritual vitality that come to rest imperceptibly in the minds and wills of men. Most of these unnumbered seeds perish and are lost because men are not prepared to receive them; for such seeds as these can not spring up anywhere except in the good soil of liberty and desire."

As we work on these four areas this year, we will be sowing all sorts of seeds. A more profound love of Jesus. A more robust and safer building, grow our ability to worship utilizing the gifts of music and reach more people within our community. Every day, every worship service, and every interaction with friends, family, and neighbors will be intentional to help us plant seeds that will lead to a harvest over the next year.

How can you help? First, **Pray**. Pray for growth in these specific areas. Prayerfully consider how you can give your time, talent, and treasure to invest in this growth. Pray for the leaders in these areas to be blessed with wisdom and strength. Second, **Volunteer**. Volunteer to be a part of these areas that God is calling you to. Finally, : Ask someone to church or encourage someone to help in any of these areas we focus on in the coming year!!

GROWING IN PRAYER

This Fall we are all about GROWTH. In this month's article, we are going to look at our own personal spiritual growth and the spiritual growth of our church.

What is spiritual growth? Spiritual growth is the process of becoming more mature in your relationship with Jesus Christ. Spiritual growth occurs when we seek to learn more about God. We can do this by connecting with other Christians, through studying the Bible, by obeying God's Word, and through our prayer habits. This article you are now reading, "Growing in Prayer," is designed each month to be a prayer guide to aid each of us in building our prayer habits; helping us to grow more spiritually the more we pray.

Pray to God and ask for wisdom concerning the areas He desires you to grow.

Pray for and thank God for our church family.

Pray for the desire and time to read your Bible.

Pray for God's help in understanding and obeying God's Word.

Pray for God's help in building good prayer habits, remembering to pray throughout each day.

Spiritual growth can be reflected through our actions. When growing spiritually there is a shift of focus from yourself to God, to your relationships with others, and to your community. This is how we can grow spiritually as a church.

The effects of your increasing spirituality can bring joy and love to your circle of influence. As a church, we are then more prepared for outreach and evangelism.

Ask yourself, are you living more for God and less for yourself?

Have your thoughts and actions toward others and God shifted or have they remained the same since the start of your relationship with Christ?

Ask God to make you a blessing to others.

As a neighborhood church, there are so many important ways that we can reach out and be a blessing to our community. This is one way to live beyond our own selves. We can strengthen our relationship with God by blessing others.

Whether its growing in spirit personally, or growing in spirit as a church, it is Christ's power in us that gives us the ability to grow spiritually. Choose by faith to rely on the Holy Spirit to guide you in thought, word, and deed.

It is God's will that we grow to be more like Jesus. We also have the promise that the Lord Himself will oversee our growth and bring us to maturity. "He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:6).

Start by asking Jesus for help. He will honor our request and efforts to grow closer to him.

Our Attitude in Worship

Last month we started our discussion about worship. A great place to start is to think about where we are in life. The things going on in my life and in the world can have a profound effect on how I show up during worship. Have you been overly stressed in your job? Are things less than stellar in your household? Has the stress of finances taken its toll on you?

Before I take time out in my day or even time on Sunday to meet with God I have to prepare myself. Sometimes it is simply asking God to help me let go. Other times it is asking Him for help to focus. In Micah 6:6-8 it gives us a simple glimpse of what God requires of us in life and in worship.

"With what shall I come before the LORD, and bow myself before God on high?

Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old?

Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil?

Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?



Notice that the focus is not what we bring to worship but how we show up. From the last verse it begins by doing justice. Do not think punitively but remember that our justice as humans is different from God's justice. Next, we are called to love kindness. Since God sent Jesus to us out of His kindness we should be just as kind to others. Lastly, walk humbly with God. We need to be honest and tell others that we do not have it all together. We are still a work in progress with God's help.

This week before we pray, read the Bible, sing a hymn, or hear the message from Jeff; let us think about how we show up for worship.

Time Away— Pastor Jeff will be gone 9/27-10/4. Pastor Baker will preach on 10/2. He is also planning on one week in December (TBD).


